April 9 statement from the Mayor of Kelleys Island

As a reminder, we are still under a "Stay At Home" order, per Governor Mike DeWine.

Starting today, April 9, procedures for package delivery on Kelleys Island will change. Now, packages will be delivered to islanders directly at their homes or businesses. Please call the Kelleys Island Ferry Boat Line at (419) 798-9763 and provide them with the best phone number where you can be reached in order to arrange delivery. If you receive packages, this is how you will be notified.

Out of state fishing licenses have been suspended at this time, according to the order. The Kelleys Island Ferry Boat Line will no longer transport fishing delegations, their vessels, and their equipment. Any lodging properties still honoring bookings for these delegations in April should cancel them.

While it is not illegal for landowners to come to their summer homes, we suggest that the following common-sense measures be taken:

- Do not bring anyone other than those you have been quarantining with since the "Stay at Home" order was instituted. (March 23).
- If your home is owned by multiple family groups, please keep it to one group at a time, unless you have all been quarantining together.
- Please keep to yourselves and your property for the duration of your stay. Practice social distancing guidelines if you need to visit a public place.
- If you plan to stay for the season, please quarantine yourself for at least 14 days and practice social distancing guidelines set by the state.

The island is not honoring permits for RVs or campers as long as the "Stay at Home" order is in effect unless it's for the purpose of working at an essential operation or business. Please call the Kelleys Island Police Department non-emergency line at (419) 746-2735 for a permit.

Thank you for your continued cooperation with these guidelines. We hope that if everyone adheres to these rules, we will contribute even further to Ohio's already successful efforts to minimize infection and fatality rates.
