President's Message

Dear KILA Members,

I want to say first off, I hope everyone is safe and healthy. The current times are unpredictable and I will try to clarify what KILA has been doing and will do moving forward for 2020. This newsletter is later than usual because of the uncertainties of the current situation.

First off, we had the Splash pad proposal presented to the Park Board in November. The board voted 4 to 1 against accepting the KILA donation of fully funding this project (with some private donations) If it would have been passed it would have been a 20 x 20 concrete pad with water shooting from the cement and a few toys. I mention this in some detail as much misinformation has been discussed online in chat rooms / etc. KILA is dedicated to enhancing the island to make it an enjoyable place for ALL. We will keep working with this in mind.

The 2020 KILA cards will NOT be issued this year. The local merchants are VERY giving in the past and we feel we will not ask for a discount for 2020. I am sure we will restart the program in 2021. Please try to patronize ALL the local KI businesses. This has hurt each and every one of our local merchants.

KILA will be (or already has) passing out 2 washable face masks to each home owner/ address if they are a KILA members or not. Limit is 2 per owner even if you own many lots. FRONTIER TELEPHONE SERVICE is moving toward Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection in 29 states. Frontier's vice president of corporate communications and external affairs, tells Channel Partners his company's business and operations are "solid and serving our customers remains our top priority. Frontier is evaluating its capital structure with an eye to reducing debt and interest expense so as to be able to better serve our customers," he said. "Our customers should expect no changes as we remain focused on providing quality communications services."



TRANSFER STATION FEES are going up this year: Permits from \$50 to \$55, the per pound charge increases from 12 to 17 cents for permit holders, 25 to 32 cents for non-permit holders.

After serving for 25 years on the Kelleys Island Fire Department Don Huntley has RETIRED!! Please join us in wishing Don well in his retirement.

The KELLEYS ISLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT has been NETWORKING with other agencies. The Sheffield Township Fire Department has generously donated 1000 feet of 4" hose to us, and we will be buying 20 hydrant adapters from them. The Brecksville Fire Department has donated an old model MSA thermal imager which will be used on the brush truck —there is already a unit on the big fire truck. Our Fire Dept. reports that six KIFD members completed the hazmat training course given last fall.



Each year EMS reminds us to call 911 if you think you have a medical problem. Do NOT try to chase down one of the EMS people. Call 911 for the fastest response.

2019 ELECTION RESULTS

The Island levies all passed and the ordinance to convert the Clerk/Treasurer position to an appointed Fiscal Officer was overturned. As a result Lisa Klonaris was elected the new Clerk/Treasurer for the Village. The Mayor (Ron Ehrbar), Board of Education (Cindy Herndon), 2 Council seats (Russell Maust-159 and Gary Finger-133) ran unopposed.

STREETS & SIDEWALKS noted that the paving project for Memory, Fernwood, part of McGettigan, and the Transfer Station will be going out for bids. The petition by McGettigan residents to be included in the project failed for lack of the required number of signatures. The Park Board has volunteers working to cut some trails into one of their preserves. The Shoreline Protection Committee is working with the Corps of Engineers for programs to assist the Village with shoreline protection.

KELLEYS ISLAND MUNICIPAL AIRPORT lands \$101K in federal funds from a Federal Aviation Administration grant program. The program supports projects strengthening aviation infrastructure nationwide. Local officials intend to spend the money on drainage improvements to eliminate ponding, or an unwanted pooling of water, on airfield surfaces. The village owns and operates this airport. "Citizens of Kelleys Island depend heavily on this airport for travel and recreation, and ensuring their safety is of the utmost importance," U.S. Rep. Marcy Kaptur,



D-Toledo said in a statement.

“These funds will directly impact the ability of the airport to maintain safe flying and landing conditions without fear of the hazards caused by water accumulation on the runway,” Kaptur added. “I am pleased to have worked with the Village of Kelleys Island and its airport to secure the financial support it requires to keep pilots and passengers safe.”

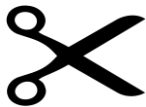
